Motion by Pekny, second by Johns to approve the consent agenda. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Consideration of a Final Plat including Medium Density Residential (R-3) and Clustered/Mix Use Overlay District (CMD) for a development of approximately 79 acres located south of Bennington Road and west of North 156th Street for a subdivision to be known as Kempten Creek

City Engineer Julie Ogden and the developer's attorney Larry Jobeun presented the residential subdivision including single family residential and 4-plex townhome dwellings. A connector street from North 156th Street to Bennington Road includes a walking trail. Speed control and slowing traffic on Kempten Creek Drive is a concern. Kempten Creek Drive will also include turn lanes where intersecting North 156th Street and Bennington Road.

John opened a public hearing and there were concerns regarding entrances and exits not existing on the plat map and street width.

Motion by John, second by Bridgeford to approve the final plat subject to subdivision, sewer, and HOA agreements being finalized and executed and compliance with the

requirements set forth in the City Engineer's Comments Letter including access points, prior to the release of the final plat. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Ordinance No. 486 Creating a New Subsection 4.11.06 to the Bennington Zoning Regulations regarding Permitted Obstructions in Required Yards and Subterranean Egress Window Access Structures in Side Yards

Ogden presented the proposed Zoning Regulations for subterranean egress window access structures in side yards.

John opened a public hearing and there were no comments.

Motion by John, second by Johns to table consideration of Ordinance No. 486. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Acquisition of Real Estate for Recreational Uses via Purchase and Donation being located southwest of North 156th Street and Bennington Road in the NE ¼ of S15, T16N, R11 east of the 6th P.M., Douglas County, NE.

John opened a public hearing and there were no comments.

Motion by John, second by Bridgeford to table consideration of the acquisition. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Bennington 156th Street Project

Motion by Johns, second by Pekny to approve Resolution 2020-02 pledging funds and awarding the construction of Project STPC-3805(5) to K2 Real Estate Development totaling \$7,607,576.08. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Motion by Bridgeford, second by Johns to approve Resolution 2020-04 recalling the City's General Obligation Refunding Bond Series 2012. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Motion by Pekny, second by Johns to introduce and waive three readings of Ordinance No. 488 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2020, OF THE CITY OF BENNINGTON, NEBRASKA, IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION TWO HUNDRED THRITY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,235,000) TO REFUND CERTAIN OUTSTANDING BONDS OF THE CITY; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS; PROVIDING FOR A SINKING FUND FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES TO PAY SAID BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF THE BONDS AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO A BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT; AUTHORIZING THE DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER; PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF THE BOND PROCEEDS AND ORDERING THE ORDINANCE PUBLISHED IN PAMPHLET FORM. The City Clerk read the Ordinance by title. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Motion by Bridgeford, second by Pekny to Adopt Ordinance No. 488. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Motion by Bridgeford, second by Johns to approve Invoice No. 114955 to JEO Consulting Group for \$3,528.75. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

The Project Tracker for 156th Street will continue to monitor developments and progress of the project.

Ordinance No. 487 Amending the Bennington Municipal Code regarding Abandoned and Trespassing Vehicles

Further review of the Ordinance is needed.

Motion by John, second by Pekny to table Ordinance No. 487. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Ordinance No. 485 Bennington Arterial Street Improvement Program and Fund Motion by Pekny, second by Bridgeford to approve the second reading and waive the third reading of Ordinance No. 485 AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE A NEW ARTICLE VI IN CHAPTER V OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF BENNINGTON SO AS TO CREATE AN ARTERIAL STREET IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND FUND FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CITY OF BENNINGTON AND ITS ZONING JURISDICTION; TO CREATE A SPECIAL FUND FOR THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF SUCH ARTERIAL STREET IMPROVEMENTS; AND TO CREATE CERTAIN FEES FOR NEW RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL, AND INDUSTRIAL BUILDING PERMITS. The City Clerk read the Ordinance by title. All vote in favor and the motion carried.

Motion by Pekny, second by Johns to approve Resolution 2020-03 revising the Personnel Manual regarding overtime pay for non-exempt City Police Officers. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Motion by John, second by Bridgeford to authorize the purchase of updates to servers, firewalls and Windows 10 for the City Police Department totaling approximately \$10,000. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Public Works Report

A culvert will be put in at the BAL 4-plex for improvements and access to Logemann Park.

Office Report

A new City sign will be ordered for the building.
