Motion by Bridgeford, second by Pekny to approve the Consent Agenda. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Consideration of a Change of Zoning from Transitional Agriculture (TA) to a Medium Density Residential District (R-3) for 194 acres in Kempten Creek Phase 3 located in the vicinity of 10760 N. 156 St. (S15, T16N, R11E)

Consideration of a Preliminary Plat for Kempten Creek Phase 3 including 364 lots located in the vicinity of 10760 N. 156 St. (S15, T16N, R11E)

City Engineer Julie Ogden and Jeff Lamontagne with E & A Consulting Group explained the proposed development and the rezoning to Medium Density Residential (R-3) for 349 single family dwelling lots and 4 commercial lots. A traffic study has been requested. Plans are to develop in two phases and include a school site.

Johns opened a public hearing and there were no comments.

Motion by Bridgeford, second by Dowding to recommend a change in zoning from Transitional Agriculture (TA) to Medium Density Residential (R-3) for 349 residential lots and approval of the Preliminary Plat both subject to compliance with the requirements of the City Engineer's review and comment letter. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Consideration of a Change of Zoning from Transitional Agriculture (TA) to a Medium Density Residential District (R-3) for 39 acres for the Evergreen Subdivision located in the vicinity of 16016 Military Rd. (S22, T16N, R11E)

Consideration of a Preliminary Plat for the Evergreen Subdivision including 87 lots located in the vicinity of 16016 Military Rd. (S22, T16N, R11E)

City Engineer Julie Ogden and Brett Shald with Foley Shald Engineering explained the proposed development and the rezoning to Medium Density Residential (R-3) for 86 single family dwelling lots. A traffic study has been requested. Coordination will take place between Douglas County, City of Omaha and the NRD for subdivision and street design and coordination and Rainwood Road extension.

Johns opened a public hearing and there were no comments.

Motion by Pekny, second by Bridgeford to recommend a change in zoning from Transitional Agriculture (TA) to Medium Density Residential (R-3) for 86 residential lots and approval of the Preliminary Plat both subject to compliance with the requirements of the City Engineer's review and comment letter. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Warehouse Street Improvement Project

This project begins at Warehouse and Molley Streets and encompasses the intersection of Warehouse and Allen Streets. Improvements considered include street removal and replacement, sanitary sewer, parking, sidewalks and pedestrian access. American Rescue Plan Act funds will be utilitzed.

Motion by Pekny, second by Dowding to approve an Agreement with JEO Consulting Group for Design/Construction Services totaling \$99,975. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Consideration of a Front Yard Setback Allowance in a Light Industrial District (I-1) located at 15311 Warehouse Street

Motion by Bridgeford, second by Pekny to approve a 12-foot setback from Warehouse Street. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Ordinance No. 507 Creating and Fixing for the First Time the Compensation of the Mayor and City Council Members

Motion by Bridgeford, second by Pekny to table Ordinance No. 507. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Nebraska Dept of Transportation

Motion by Pekny, second by Bridgeford to approve the 2021 Certificate of Compliance and the 2022 Agreement Renewal for Highway 36 Snow Removal totaling \$3,298.40. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Resolution 2022-01 Approve Signing of MAPA's Allocation of Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act (CRRSAA) totaling \$75,000 Motion by Pekny, second by Dowding to approve Resolution 2022-01 accepting CRRSAA funds. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

156th Street Project

Motion by Dowding, second by Pekny to table a payment of Nebraska Dept of Transportation Invoice No. 0645388 totaling \$48,404.49. All voted in favor and the motion carried.
